FireSmart and Emergency Preparedness

If an emergency happens in your community, it may take emergency workers some time to reach you. You should be prepared to take care of yourself and your family for a minimum of 72 hours.

The Government of Alberta has created a number of resources, in collaboration with other key stakeholders, to raise awareness and educate individuals and communities to prepare for disasters and emergencies.

Emergency preparedness in Alberta can also involve making your home "FireSmart"; although primarily focused on wildfire, many of the tips apply to grassland fires as well.



To help protect your home from wildfire, FireSmart it:

- remove flammable items that are within 5 feet of your property
- keep roof and gutters free from debris
- prune trees and shrubs regularly
- conduct a FireSmart home assessment
